

Template press release – Annual canvass

Local residents to receive important voter registration information

Households in Angus and Perth & Kinross will soon be receiving a form asking residents to check whether the information that appears on the electoral register for those living at their address is correct as part of the annual voter registration canvass.

The aim of the Household Enquiry Form is to ensure that the electoral register is up to date and to identify any residents who are not registered so that they can be encouraged to do so.

Those who are aged 16 may be able to vote in local government and Scottish Parliament elections. The Electoral Registration Officer for Angus Council and Perth & Kinross Council encourages those eligible to vote for the first time to register to vote.

Mr Alastair Kirkwood, the Electoral Registration Officer said:

“The annual canvass is an opportunity for people to easily check whether they’re registered. This includes anyone who will be 16 years old by 30 November 2018. Anyone that wants to vote must be registered.

To make sure you are able to vote in elections, simply check the form when it arrives and return it as soon as possible.

We would encourage you to take advantage of the facility of being able to reply online, by telephone, or by text message.

You can also complete and return the form in the reply paid envelope provided to you.

If the information is different to that on the form, you can still provide details via the online service or by completing the form. You can also ask for a postal vote or proxy vote and we will arrange to send application forms to you.

If you’re not currently registered, please reply and we will send you information explaining how to do this or you can just go online to apply to register at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.”

It’s particularly important that anyone who has moved address recently looks out for the form and checks whether they are registered at the correct address.

If you have changed address in the last year, it’s particularly likely that you will need to register at your new address, so check the form as soon as it arrives.”
